### **Scout Department EXHIBITORS PLEASE NOTE:**

In this department we have several different age divisions, please check them before entering. **Be sure to indicate the correct division on your entry form.** If exhibitor is less than 18 years of age, include your age and your parent signature where indicated. Failure to comply with these rules may result in disqualification of the entry.

### **Special Rules and Regulations for Scouts**

(See General Rules for further instruction)

1. You must be enrolled with a Boy Scout or Girl Scout troop for the 2018-2019 club year.
2. Exhibitors are responsible for selecting the proper division and class for each entry. Entries improperly classified at the time of receiving may result in not being judged.
3. Unlimited entries are allowed for all classes unless specified. Premiums are limited to the top 2 per class per exhibitor.
4. All entries may not be displayed based on variety and space available. Coordinator will make final decision regarding placement.
5. All exhibits must be properly and securely labeled with member name, club, division and class. Exhibits not properly identified may not be judged or displayed. Artwork submitted on a canvas or frame must be securely wire hung for display or it will not be accepted.
6. Poster Exhibits shall be on standard size boards – poster, foam board or tri-fold display board (cardboard or foam board). Demonstration posters are not acceptable.
7. No live animals are permitted to exhibit in this department.
8. Management and judges reserve the right to remove exhibits which are considered obscene or harmful to minors as defined in the Arizona Criminal Code.
9. The Coordinator reserves the right to remove and dispose of plants and/or food showing signs of decay/spoilage during the run of the fair.
10. Exhibits must be the sole work of the scout and made during the past year. Exhibits must not have been entered in previous Arizona State Fairs, however may have been entered in member's respective county fair. Blue ribbon or rosette at county fair is not required of exhibits, but all exhibits should be worthy of competition.
11. It shall be at the sole discretion of the judges whether the entries are awarded Blue, Red, White or Rosette and corresponding premium money. No division or class may be reopened after the judging is finished.
12. Judging is closed to the public. Information on awards is available after opening day of fair.
13. Exhibits are judged by the Danish system. Ribbons mean the following- Blue Ribbon- Excellent/exceeds minimum standards, Red Ribbon- Good/Meets minimum standards, White Ribbon- Fair/does not meet minimum standards, No Ribbon –Cannot be judged due to being misclassified or being incomplete, Rosette Ribbon- may be awarded to exhibits deemed worthy to be outstanding.
14. Photography
  - a. Kindergarten through 8<sup>th</sup> Grade – 4x6 or 5x7 photo mounted on 8x10 board
  - b. 9<sup>th</sup> Grade – 12<sup>th</sup> Grade – 8x10 photo mounted on 11x14 board
  - c. Label on back of each board with name, age, type of camera, computer enhancements, division and class
15. Writing must be decoratively mounted on poster board, cardstock or heavy weight paper with 2" – 4" margin.

**Design a display representing your troop, history of unit or the history of the organization. Educate the public on Scouts of America, your troop’s achievements or what scouting means to you. Include your motto, slogan or mission! Be creative!**

Display Guidelines – Contest is open to clubs, troop or unit within. Standard poster board and tri-fold boards are accepted. Display size should be no larger than 5’ wide x 3’ high. Design should include official youth organization symbols. Permission to use trademarked material must be obtained by exhibitor. Display may not be commercially made, decorations must be attached securely.
