### **Floriculture - Horticulture EXHIBITORS PLEASE NOTE:**

In this department we have Youth: age 12 and under, Teen: age 13 – 18, Adult: age 19 +, Professional (Receives payment for Floral/Horticultural work) and Person(s) with Disabilities. **Be sure to indicate the correct division on your entry form.** If exhibitor is less than 18 years of age, include your age and your parent signature where indicated. Failure to comply with these rules may result in disqualification of the entry.

### **Special Rules and Regulations for Floriculture - Horticulture**

(See General Rules for further instruction)

1. When fruits, vegetables and/or plants become wilted, they will be discarded without prior notification.
2. Unlimited Entries are allowed for all classes unless specified. Premiums are limited to the top 2 per class per exhibitor.
3. All entries may not be displayed based on variety and space available. Coordinator will make final decision regarding placement.
4. The exhibitor must have grown or produced entries. Proof of ownership/production must be produced if requested by the Coordinator or Judge.
5. If more than three entries of the same variety are entered in "Any other" class, a new class may be created so that they can be judged in their own category.
6. It shall be at the sole discretion of the judges whether the entries are awarded First, Second, Third or Honorable Mention and corresponding premium money. At the discretion of the judges and Coordinator, classes may be combined where closely related, provided an insufficient number or entries in any one class do not provide adequate competition. No division or class may be reopened after the judging is finished.
7. All picked produce becomes property of State Fair once entered will be discarded without prior notification at close of the Fair.
8. All Horticulture entries will become property of the Fair and will not be returned to exhibitors, with the exception of potted plants and arrangement display material.
9. Only the judges' books will be used as evidence for payment of premiums. Ribbons or tags are not accepted as proof of results.
10. Judging is closed to the public.
11. The decision of the judges shall in all cases be final.
12. Judging is based on conformance, design, distinction, artistic concept, and expression.

All honey and pollen must be displayed in three industry standard glass or plastic 1 to 2 lb jars. All honey and pollen must be marketable and free of foreign matter. Pollen pellets must be dried, not flattened, powdery or uniform in shape. Combs must be new combs wrapped in heavy cellophane or be in a single frame observation hive. No labels on jar, No pads on combs. All apiary exhibits must have been produced within the last twelve months.
