

2020 Youth Dairy Cattle

The Arizona State Fair is currently planning on holding youth livestock shows in a live, in person format. Should that change, a Virtual show will be offered to exhibitors.



***PLEASE NOTE: IF LIVE SHOW GOES FORWARD, IT WILL BE A BLOW AND GO SHOW. NO FITTING WILL TAKE PLACE AT THE FAIRGROUNDS.**

****IF LIVE SHOW GOES FORWARD – EVERYONE (EXHIBITORS, JUDGE, CLERKS, PARENTS, SIBLINGS, AND AUDIENCE) WILL BE REQUIRED TO WEAR PROPER FACE MASKS/COVERINGS.**

***A MINIMUM OF 10 EXHIBITORS (FOR THE DEPARTMENT) MUST ENTER. IF LESS THAN 10 EXHIBITORS, SHOW WILL AUTOMATICALLY BE A VIRTUAL SHOW.**

SPECIAL RULES – READ CAREFULLY

IMPORTANT: Read carefully all GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS, YOUTH DIVISIONS RULES AND REGULATIONS and all HEALTH RULES AND REGULATIONS.

1. THE **DEADLINE** for Youth Dairy entries is September 25. Entries will close sooner if capacity is reached. See General Rules Entry Requirements for additional explanation.
2. Entry must be completed online. ENTRY FEE: \$10.00 per head for each animal is required. Please include a copy of the Dept. of Ag Seasonal pass along with your entry. **For online entries, upload copy of seasonal pass and signature form within 5 days of deadline.**
3. Animals may be Registered or Grade. Separate classes will be shown for registered and Grade animals, except for Class 121 & Class 122. Grade animals will not be eligible to compete in the Open Dairy Cattle Show.
4. Must show registration papers or animal will be classified and shown grade. Grade animals must show major dairy breed characteristics and show in the class of major breed characteristic.
5. All stalls and pens, aisles, wash rack and milk parlor areas are to be kept clean at all times. If warned twice by Coordinator to clean any part of exhibitor's area, prize money may be forfeited. A stall sign displaying the exhibitor's name, animal's name and club, chapter or organization must be posted on animal's stall or pen.
6. Animals must be clipped at home. Touch ups ONLY are allowed at fair.
7. Exhibitor will NOT BE ALLOWED in the show ring without being in Show Dress (Show Whites) or Official FFA Dress.
8. First bedding will NOT be provided but will be available for purchase at the feed store, or you may bring your own.
9. Portable milkers are allowed to be used. Maricopa County Fair is not responsible or liable for any diseases or illnesses obtained from the milking parlor or portable milkers.
10. Externally sealing the teat with a preparation that is approved for this purpose and does not harm the animal's skin is permissible. Natural teat placement must be kept.
11. In addition to the IAFE National Showring Code of Ethics, the following unethical practices or procedure include:
 - A. Any alteration of appearance, physical change by removal or injection is strictly prohibited.
 - B. Misrepresenting the age and/or the milking status of an animal.
 - C. Unnatural udder balancing.
 - D. Setting the teats (mechanical or chemical preparation).
 - E. Treating any part of the body (internally or externally) with any substance or method to mask deformities, weakness, or produce unnatural animation.
 - F. Unnatural surgery performed to change the natural appearance.
 - G. Insertion of foreign material.
 - H. Changing to color of hair at any point, spot or area.

I. use of alcoholic beverages in the feed or given as a drench.

J. Administration of a drug which affects circulatory, respiratory or central nervous system of an animal, except for treating a recognized disease or injury.

K. Criticizing or interfering with the judge, show management or other exhibitors while in the show ring or any other conduct detrimental to the show will also result in award forfeiture.
